My friends, as a direct result of your support this last year, I know that my family and I will never face this hardship again because I am now a **homeowner in control of my destiny.** You have given my family, and so many other families, the ability to live strong, stable, and self-reliant lives.

You have given us security, affordability, peace of mind, and legacy. You replaced what was a horrid and turbulent time with bliss.

I will never forget those of you I met on the build site who were generous, kind, hardworking, and fixated on making sure that every detail of my home was perfect. I will never forget those of you I met at my home dedication, whose donations made my home and my happiness possible. For these memories, for you, I am very grateful.

Thank you for supporting Habitat for Humanity Chicago's mission of helping families like mine. I hope you are proud of all that we have done together this last year. I certainly am.

Course topics include First Time Homeownership, Mortgages and Deeds, Property Taxes, Financial Fitness, Home Maintenance, Community Engagement, and Estate Planning. Classes are open to friends, family, and other current or prospective homeowners.

In partnership with Habitat for Humanity of Northern Fox Valley, we operate ReStore Chicago, a 30,000 square foot home improvement resale store. ReStore Chicago is our own ecosystem in action, accepting new and gently used donations and selling them at a discount to the public. All profits help fund the Habitat mission in the Chicago area.


